**A message from our President, Morris Capouya**

Oh, how time flies...it has been 10 years since I was first elected President of Temple Beth Or and wrote my first newsletter message to the congregation. When I reflect, I was a little overwhelmed by the sheer responsibility that comes with the position, and my initial goals were to try to keep everyone happy and to continue the congregational momentum that had started with the hiring of Rabbi Stevens just a year prior to my taking office. In my first couple of months on the job, we launched a new professional website hosted by the URJ, and began to promote a joint trip to Israel. The website performed well and was the basis for a more improved version which you can access today. Unfortunately, the trip to Israel never took place. We all experience achievements and failures, but what I remember most about my first term as President is the great support group I received from our officers and board members, as well as from Rabbi Elliott Stevens and Gina Friday.

If you have not met him personally, I urge you to attend one of the meet & greet events that Temple members are hosting in their homes through the end of August or take the time to schedule a meeting with him during his Temple office hours.

With the High Holidays only a few weeks away, I want to ask all congregants to consider participating during one or more of the services offered during the High Holidays. It is an honor only awarded to members, so please contact Gina and she can forward you more information on this opportunity.

As my second term as President commences, I am honored to again have the opportunity to work with a great supporting cast of officers and board members who I will rely on along with Rabbi Looper and Gina Friday to guide us moving forward together.

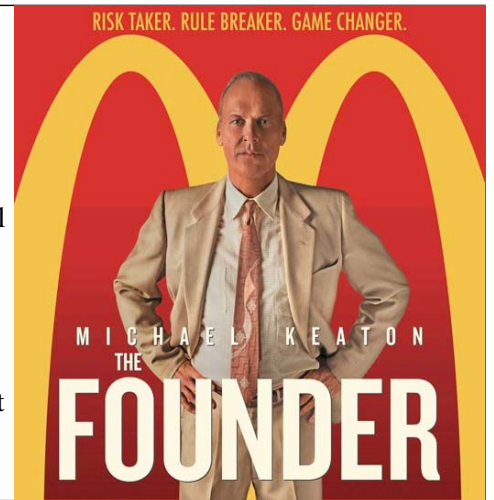

## A SERVICE FOR HEALING ON YOM KIPPUR

The service on Yom Kippur will include a Healing Service beginning at 4:15 p.m. on Wednesday afternoon, October 12. The service will be co-led by Rabbi Loper and Turia Stark Williams.

Healing services are not magic. In Judaism, healing services can provide solace, comfort, a sense of direction, spiritual growth, and inner peace. Healing services are informal and personal, often involving guided meditation, chant, silences, soul searching, and spiritually uplifting prayers, and readings, including meditative music. It is an experience unlike any other, and without the choreography that typifies a more traditional-type service.

The Yom Kippur healing service will follow the Afternoon Service.

## Yom Kippur

Yom Kippur means “Day of Atonement” and refers to the annual Jewish observance of fasting, prayer, and repentance. Part of the High Holidays, which also includes Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur is considered the holiest day on the Jewish calendar. In three separate passages in the Torah, the Jewish people are told, “the tenth day of the seventh month is the Day of Atonement. It shall be a sacred occasion for you: You shall practice self-denial.” (Leviticus 23:27). Fasting is seen as fulfilling this biblical commandment. The Yom Kippur fast also enables us to put aside our physical desires to concentrate on our spiritual needs through prayer, repentance, and self-improvement.

Yom Kippur is the moment in Jewish time when we dedicate our mind, body, and soul to reconciliation with God, our fellow human beings, and ourselves. We are commanded to turn to those whom we have wronged first, acknowledging our sins and the pain we might have caused. At the same time, we must be willing to forgive and to let go of certain offenses and the feelings of resentment they provoked in us. On this journey we are both seekers and givers of pardon. Only then can we turn to God and ask for forgiveness: “And for all these, God of forgiveness, forgive us, pardon us, and grant us atonement.”

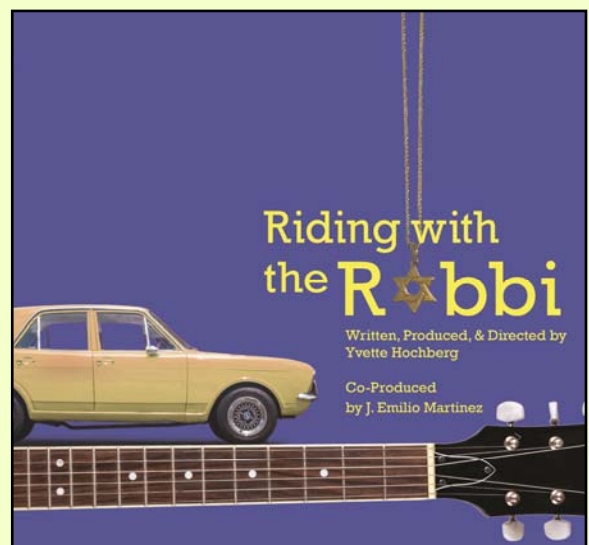

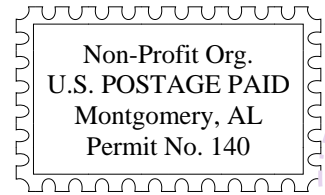
