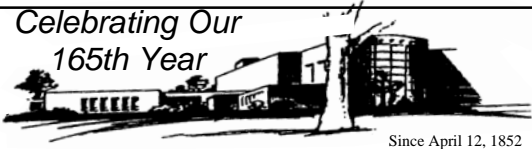

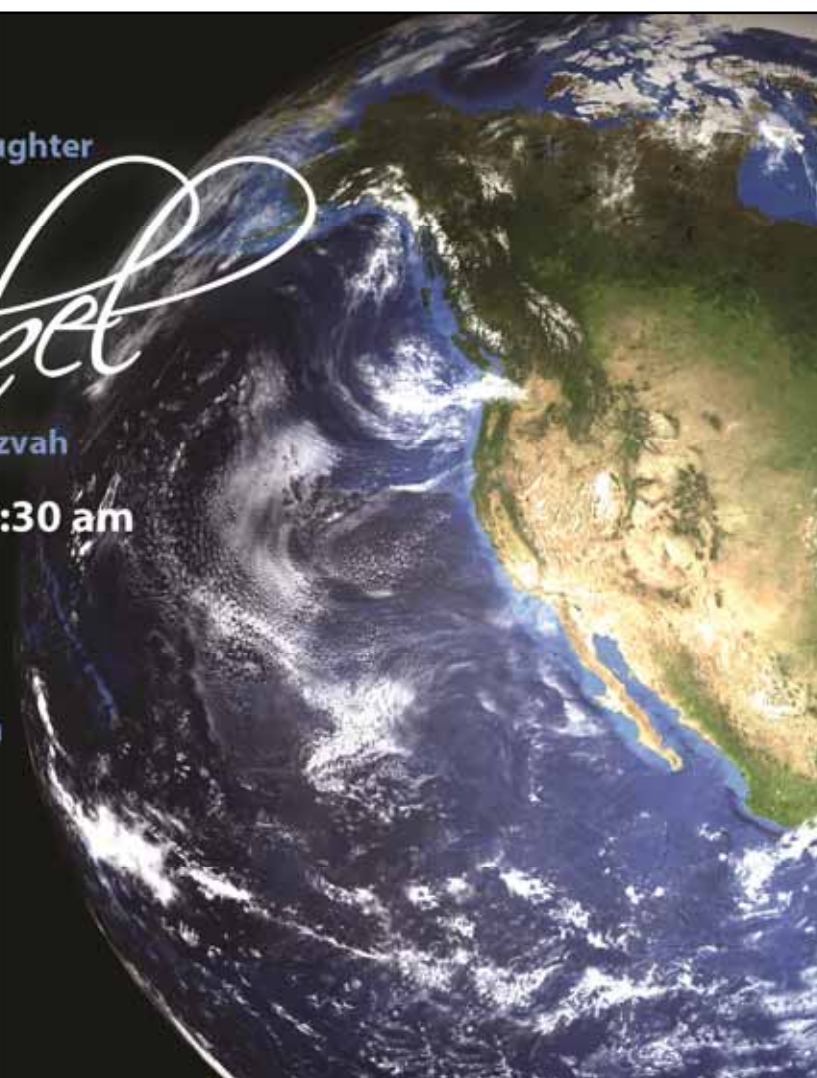

Hi,
I'm about to have a bat mitzvah at Temple Emanu-El in Birmingham. First of all, I'd be very happy if you all can come. It's October 14th of this year at 10:30 on Shabbat morning. Second, as my mitzvah project, I'm raising money for the Southern Environmental Law Center (SELC), a non-profit advocacy group protecting the environment for over 30 years. Genesis/Bereshith, the Torah portion I'm chanting, has been calling us to safeguard all of creation for over 3,000 years. So, I thought my Torah portion and SELC would be a great match.

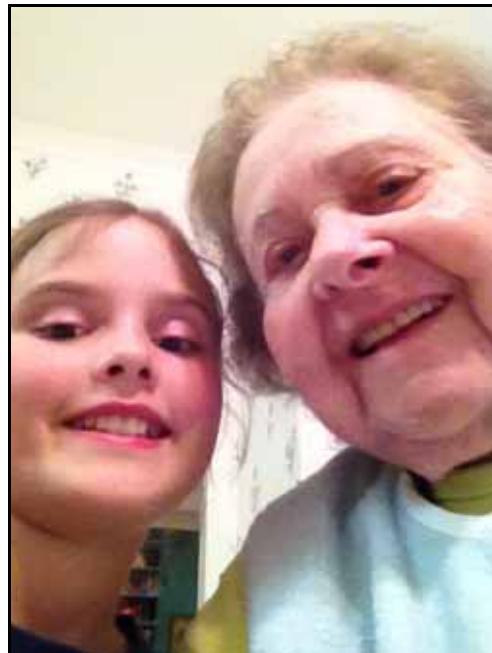
SELC believes that everyone deserves to breathe clean air, drink clean water, and live in a healthy, stable environment. SELC uses the power of the law to defend this region's air quality, rivers, forests, coasts, and countryside. If there is an environmental issue affecting the South, chances are that SELC is in the middle of it.

This is particularly important given that if the southern states were viewed as a country, it would be the 8th largest contributor to global warming in the world. SELC is moving the South away from its over-reliance on the dirtiest of fossil fuels, including by securing plans to retire or clean-up old coal-fired polluting plants; cleaning up 65 million tons of coal ash; promoting new solar programs; and challenging sprawl-inducing highways. As a result of their work, CO2 emissions from electric power generation in our region has declined by 29%, even as population increased.

A pressing challenge of my generation will be to confront climate change. I was glad to know that SELC has been at it for some time. If you would like to assist SELC's efforts to reduce carbon emissions and embrace cleaner energy sources like wind and solar, please consider making a donation by sending a check made payable to "Southern Environmental Law Center" to my attention at: P.O. Box 231348, Montgomery, AL 36123.

Again, all of you are invited and more than welcome to come to my bat mitzvah!

We very much need help during morning hours during the week of February 20 -24. If you are available during those times, please let us know.


The Treasure and Collectible Market is ready to accept items. Please take the

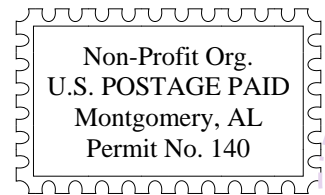

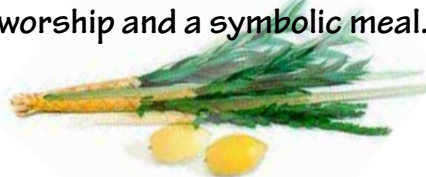
